
ballerina and to check out a dance/ballet themed book from the library's special display. Drop in, please come first to the children's desk for nametags.



Jarrett J. Krosoczka (JJK) is the New York Times bestselling author/illustrators behind more than forty books for young readers, including his wildly popular Lunch Lady graphic novels, select volumes of the Star Wars™.Jedi Academy series, and Hey, Kiddo, which



was a National Book Award Finalist. The sequel, Sunshine, is now nominated for the Eisner Award, which is like the Oscars of comics. His viral TED talks and video tutorials have been viewed millions of times worldwide. Krosoczka (Crow-sauce-kah) creates books with humor, heart, and deep respect for his young readers—qualities that have made his titles perennial favorites on the bookshelves of homes, libraries, and bookstores over the past twenty years. THE WHALEMOBILE'

An inflatatable LIFE SIZED WHALE is visiting the library!

Cynde McInnis, a naturalist from Gloucester, MA who has spent 31 seasons working on whale watch boats, is coming to the library with her life-sized (43 ft.) inflatable whale, Nile.

Come by the library and meet Nile, a 37-year old humpback whale whom McInnis has seen almost every summer since 1994 off the coast of Massachusetts.

Go **inside** of the inflatable whale and learn about how whales are similar to and different from humans. Learn about Nile's migratory path, how many calves she's had, as well as how researchers learned this information. See and touch balleen, teeth and whale bones! Be inspired to care about the oceans and the environment around us.
